Universities like to read references that are honest but that also focus on strengths, not weaknesses. Rob Evans, Head of Admissions at University of Sussex says that he is looking for 'reasons to make an offer, rather than to reject'. When you edit the reference, consider how to accentuate the applicant's strengths.

UCAS University Application References

Under the Data Protection Act 1998 references given by staff of the University are exempted from subject access requests where the references relate to appointments. This means that the writer of the reference is exempt from the data access provisions. Confidential references received by the University are not exempt from the right of access.

Harvard referencing style uses references in two places in a piece of writing: in the text and in a reference list at the end. In general, each author name that appears in the

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text must also appear in the reference list, and every work in the reference list must also be referred to in the main text.

The school/college reference tells us about an applicant's abilities and potential. Admissions Tutors look for indications that a student 's academic strengths are well suited both to the course and to the style of study at Cambridge. Comments from subject specialists that show evidence of an applicant 's intellectual flexibility and curiosity, analytic ability, logical reasoning and the ability to learn quickly are extremely useful.
